



State Health Officer has issued several public health orders related to specific industries – and at the time of this writing the orders are on the sixteenth continuation and modification of Health Order 2. The numerous orders include the prohibition of indoor gatherings of more than 50 people in a single confined space - unless the event is one of the several exceptions listed. 
