Tim Hiers, Director of Golf Course Operations, The Dye Course at White Oak Conservation, Yulee, Florida The goals for renovation of an existing golf course may include reductions of usage in the following areas: water, electricity, fuel consumption, labor, fertilizers, plant protectants, hand labor, and equipment usage where practical. Improvements will be made in these areas: aesthetics, turf health and resiliency, drainage, air movement, sunlight, playability, and increased speed of play. The design will accommodate players with varying skill levels, reduce liability, and increase safety for golfers and staff. The items will be addressed, as well as numerous other considerations.

9:50 – 10:50 a.m. Water x Weeds: Building an Integrated Weed Management Approach

Becky Grubbs Bowling, Ph.D., Assistant Professor and Extension Specialist - Turfgrass Science and Management, University of Tennessee

This presentation considers the impact of irrigation practices, rainfall, and soil characteristics on weed ecology and herbicide movement in turfgrass systems. Review how too much or too little water can lead to the spread of select hard-to-control weeds and how modifying cultural practices can significantly reduce weed pressure. There will be additional discussion on how soil moisture and post-application watering practices can influence off-target movement of herbicides through soil movement, runoff and volatilization/drift.

Through Dr. Bowling's partnerships with stakeholders, she has also helped promote professional development and environmental stewardship through initiatives like the Certified Professional Turfgrass Management program, Water Efficient Recognized Green Professionals, and the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA) BMP effort.

William T. "Tim" Hiers has been a golf course manager since 1976. His accomplishments include assisting Collier's Reserve Country Club become the first Audubon International Cooperative Signature Sanctuary Golf Course. In 2000, Tim joined The Old Collier Golf Club and led the effort to achieve the designation of first Audubon International Gold Signature Cooperative Sanctuary. This project is the first in the continental United States to use the newer variety of Paspalum grass on the entire golf course and the first in the world to irrigate solely with brackish water. Throughout his career he has been active both nationally and regionally, has spoken over 100 times nationally and internationally, and has toured over 4,500 school children in past 30 years. He is a past recipient of both the GCSAA Excellence in Government Relations Award and the USGA Green Section Award. Since 2018, he has been the Director of Golf Course Operations at The Dye Course at White Oak Conservation, Yulee, Florida. The Dye Course at White Oak is a private, ecologically managed golf course that is part of a world-class retreat experience and was Pete Dye's last design. In 2022, Golf Digest awarded it as the Best New Private Course winner.

Doug Karcher, Ph.D., has been appointed as the Chair of the Department of Horticulture and Crop Science at The Ohio State University since 2021. In this role, he serves the College of Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences by facilitating the department's diverse teaching, research, and extension programs.
